Through adult education, GED preparation, and job readiness training, we aim to not only stabilize, but to empower women, ensuring a healthy start to their a life.
	After completing the program, graduates will be given the opportunity to enroll in our Continuum of Care which provides ongoing support services as they secure employment and transition back into an independent life.

Provider Description	Olivia's House provides holistic care for chemically dependent women and their children. Children, up to age 10, live with their mothers at Olivia's House during the course of residential treatment, a period of up to twelve months.
	The length of the sober living phase of treatment at Olivia's House is individualized. The actual length of a woman's stay will be dependent upon the severity of her illness, her response to treatment, and the availability of independent living resources.
	After discharge from the residential program, women may continue to attend aftercare groups to help maintain recovery efforts and to assist in the translation to an independent lifestyle. Aftercare support groups are held weekly at Olivia's House and are designed to help clients in the day to day process of developing a high quality lifestyle.
	Children will receive routine medical services at varying locations that includes vision, hearing, and dental care. Children needing specialized care will be referred to the appropriate community resource. Coordination of children's services will be a function of case management, the child development staff, and the nursing staff. Separate records documenting service delivery will be kept on all children. These services, including medical care, will be available for all of the women's children who are in residence with her.
